Supplemental Number 1 for Main St Phase 1

Stephen from HLA explained the project is almost complete, but the city has full access to it already. Project came in eighty thousand under budget reducing the city's contribution. We are just waiting for light post to come in which should be at the end of the month. During construction a water main was fixed by Tri-Valley for a very reduced price. Stephen stated the project was estimated at ten times more than we paid. Councilmember Isiordia asked why the road is so uneven if HLA was overseeing it. Per Stephen, that was the plan to help with the drainage. The median had to be redone already once because of the different elevations but that is the way it was designed. Councilmember Isordia explained it looks sloppy. Kim explained if we don't follow TIB plans we don't get any funding for this project. Hilda mentioned with the project coming under budget what was the savings? Do we have a plan as to where it is budgeted for the supplemented for the \$17k. Kim explained it coming out of the main street project because we came under budget, so we paid it out of there because we had come under budget. Israel said hopefully next time we can be more involved because the community is not happy with the work. So, with a project this big and costly hopefully we can do something that we can be proud of. Councilmember Stonemetz explained that he can't even make the turn out of the post office with a box truck. Stephen explained they had a traffic analysis on where it passed, and you should be able to make that turn. Councilmember Gonzalez commented was the median part of the initial plan. Stephen

explained it wasn't then it was put in because of the accidents that would happen with opposite traffic.
